'Five Kinds of Silence'

by Shelagh Stephenson
directed by Kirsty Harbron
21-28 February 2009

" I love my family. They're mine. I love them. What's different about me, see is that I love them more than what you might call normal."

When asked why I wanted to direct a play about such a harrowing and bleak topic, I replied that I was struck by the power, intensity and beauty of the writing. Stephenson has created a compelling tapestry of monologues and interviews which unravel the shocking story of cycles of abuse within a family. Yet this play is not just about abuse; it is about control, madness and despair; themes which, at some point, will resonate with each member the audience.

Originally performed as a radio play, then first staged in 2000, the play contains wonderfully

figurative and descriptive language, which has cultivated many theatrical possibilities during the rehearsal process. The cast have been able to explore beyond the words and work in ways that have been both challenging and rewarding.

Working as an ensemble, they have explored the play's themes as well as characterisation and have developed their own in-

terpretation of the text. I've had the privilege of

They comprise of both established members and newcomers, making this an exciting blend of talent and experience, including Sandra Ventris as Mary, who was recently seen, briefly yet comically, in 'True West', adding to many previous roles at the theatre.

The challenging roles of Susan and Janet are played powerfully by Lyn Fernee and Sarah Charsley, respectively. Darren Cockrill and Amanda Urwin-Mann perform many authority figures who try to deconstruct the women's lives and un-

derstand their silence.

This production uses a striking set and innovative sound design by Janusz Rust and lighting design by Carl Boardman to create a piece of total theatre not to be missed.

Attending this play is not intended to be a miserable experience, but rather a thought-provoking one. Theatre's function is not just to entertain - this play contains a universal, powerful message. Looking at recent news articles should reinforce the contemporary relevance of this play; it reflects a shocking, hidden truth.

Here's an update:

You'll see, elsewhere in this newsletter, details of a play reading on Friday 13th February. This will be an informal members' get together to read and hear a new play and discuss its merits in the bar afterwards. We hope to hold these regularly, but that depends on the level of interest, so please support this first one!

Pat Boxall had a great response to her auditions for "Festen" and now has a very strong cast for this fine play, which is our first Festival production this year.

Our second Festival show will be a hugely entertaining Tom Stoppard double bill, "The Real Inspector Hound" and "After Magritte" from 19th-24th May and directed by Mark Wilson and Martin Nichols.

Strat Mastoris is directing a powerful Genet double bill ("The Maids" and "Deathwatch") in the June slot instead of "Madame Rousseau" which was scheduled for July. We decided that this new play needed more time for development before being ready for performance and hope we can work with the writer on this.

This leaves the July production vacant, so ideas from directors would be welcome.

I've been talking to various directors regarding the 2009/10 Season and I'm pleased to say there's a lot of exciting ideas floating around. I'm going to try to finalise the programme by May so that means I need proposals during February. In the first instance just talk to me about plays you're passionate about so I can discuss them with my support team. Those that are short listed will need a full submission by the directors concerned and approval by the committee.

My objectives for next season are to have a popular and balanced programme of high quality scripts. What do I mean by "balanced"? Well, I could write a book, but I'd rather talk about it, so come and see me on Saturday mornings 10-12 at the theatre.

All the best and here's hoping I've not missed anything!

Audition Notice

'The Maids' and 'Deathwatch' by Jean Genet

Directed by Strat Mastoris

Both 'The Maids' and 'Deathwatch' are plays about people who are trapped, and who try to find ways to overcome their imprisonment. Physical escape is not possible, so the characters employ psychological means to assert their existence.

In 'The Maids', two housemaids, sisters in their thirties, have been forced by economic and class reasons into the employ of Madame, a bourgeois woman in her twenties. They are dependent on Madame, they envy and hate her, and they hate themselves both for envying and for wanting to **be** her. The maids have arranged the imprisonment of Madame's lover and prepare to poison Madame herself. The plot begins to unravel, however, and so one sister prepares her own ultimate escape ...

The protagonists in 'Deathwatch' are physically imprisoned inside the stone blocks of a gaol cell. Status is conferred by the severity of a man's crime, and Green Eyes is a condemned murderer awaiting execution. Tensions mount as the other two cell-mates jockey for position and attempt to usurp Green Eyes' authority within the cell.

The action of both plays is very constrained: a bedroom and (even more limited) a prison cell. Characters circle round each other in a confined space, and the emotional pressure cooker heats up. Genet was fascinated by the ritualistic struggles of outcasts and their oppressors, and this pair of plays will make for a gripping evening at the NVT. YOU can make it happen.

	The Guard	Could be any age


It's the age balance among the characters that will make the play work, not their exact ages, so don't worry if you are not in the specified age range, someone else may not be either.

We also need crew for this production: **Stage Manager, Set Designer, Set Builders, Costume Designer, Costume Liaison, Props, Sound Designer, Lighting and Sound Operators, Et Cetera .**

Auditions will take place on **Sunday 1 March** at NVT, from 2 - 6 pm in the South Hall, with call-backs Tuesday 3 March 7-9 pm. Please contact Strat or Tamsin to arrange times, as we are splitting the afternoon between auditions for the two plays.

The production itself runs from **20 - 27 June** 2009

Denise Evans - Voice for Performance workshops will incorporate diverse techniques; inspired by the work of Grotowski (Poland), Kabuki Theatre (Japan), and the techniques of Patsy Rodenburg (England). Voice work that engages the heart, the mind and the body, aiming to free the voice, connect with the breath, and allowing the actor to speak with clarity and passion.

Participants should wear loose and comfortable clothing.

Denise has worked as a theatre practitioner since 1982, and has worked with numerous companies as an actor, director, and teacher of voice and performance skills. Companies include Kaboodle Productions, Volcano, BAC, Boilerhouse, Komedija, Glasgow Citizen's, The Young Vic and Vital Theatre. Most recently she played the title role in Company: Collisions' *Medea* at the Butrinti Classical Theatre Festival in Albania. Denise is currently directing George Dillon's *The Man Who Was Hamlet*, for Vital Theatre, touring in 2009, and Sarah Leaver's new piece, *Memoirs of a Hermaphrodite*, which premiered in Brighton in December 2008.




Towards the end of the season the voting will start, with a reminder of the season's productions.
